



EVA & UNI Air Launch Scheduled Flights between Taiwan and China

Travellers connected to 12 major cities via one easy stop in Taiwan

EVA Air and its regional subsidiary UNI Air will begin operating scheduled flights from Taiwan to China on August 31, 2009.

The two carriers will serve 12 destinations and fly 19 routes to China's major cities, including Beijing, Shanghai, Guangzhou, Hangzhou, Kunming, Xiamen, Shenzhen, Tianjin, Dalian, Ningbo, Chengdu and Qingdao. Services to Wuhan and Chongqing will be added from September 28, bringing the airlines' combined frequency to 55 flights per week.

Passengers can make reservations now through travel agents worldwide, by contacting an EVA office or online at www.evaair.com. In addition to Taiwan's premier gateway Taoyuan International Airport, Taipei, business and leisure travellers can also connect to destinations in China from Taipei's second airport Song Shan, Taichung International Airport in central Taiwan and Kaohsiung International Airport in southern Taiwan.

EVA and UNI Air will serve China's major cities with flights to almost every region of the country:

Northern China

- Taoyuan to Beijing five times per week
- Taoyuan to Tianjin two times per week
- Taoyuan to Dalian two times per week

Eastern China

- Taoyuan to Shanghai nine times per week
- Kaohsiung to Shanghai two times per week
- Taoyuan to Hangzhou seven times per week
- Taichung to Hangzhou once a week
- Kaohsiung to Hangzhou two times per week
- Taoyuan to Ningbo five times per week

- Kaohsiung to Ningbo once a week

Central China

- Taoyuan to Kunming two times per week
- Kaohsiung to Chengdu once a week

Southern China

- Song Shan to Xiamen two times per week
- Taichung to Xiamen once a week
- Taoyuan to Guangzhou three times per week
- Taoyuan to Shenzhen three times per week
- Taichung to Shenzhen once a week
- Kaohsiung to Shenzhen once a week.

The additional services to be introduced at the end of September consist of twice-weekly flights from Taoyuan to both Wuhan and Chongqing.

EVA and UNI Air's frequent flights to destinations in every region of China offer travellers tremendous flexibility, with a range of open-jaw itineraries possible.

EVA will operate the latest Boeing 777-300ers, Airbus 330-200s and Boeing 747-400s on most of its flights from Taoyuan into China. UNI Air will use MD-90s for services from Song Shan, Taichung and Kaohsiung.

EVA Cargo will operate Boeing 747-400 freighters between Taoyuan and Shanghai three times a week and is cooperating with Air China Cargo by swapping space. The two carriers will also cooperate on the Taoyuan – Guangzhou route, based on market demand.

In addition to the new scheduled services throughout China, EVA will continue its long established flights to Hong Kong and Macau from Taoyuan. The Taiwan-based airline operates six times per week from London to Taipei via Bangkok.

EVA Air operates scheduled services to Taipei via Bangkok from London's Heathrow airport six times per week. The route is serviced used B777-400ER and B747-400 equipment.

EVA Air currently serves 49 destinations across four continents from its Taipei hub. Its 54 aircraft comprise three B747-400s, four B747 Combis, nine B747 Freighters, eight MD-11 Freighters, six MD-90s, 12 B777-300ERs, 11 A330-200s and one A320.
