EVA Air launches new Monday service to Bangkok and Taipei

From March 29, 2010, EVA Air, Taiwan's leading independent airline, will operate daily flights to Taipei via Bangkok with the introduction of a new Monday service.

The new Monday flight increases EVA Air's capacity on the London Heathrow – Bangkok/Taipei route by 316 seats a week. Flights will depart London Heathrow Terminal 3 at 21:20, arriving Bangkok the following day at 15:40, before continuing to Taipei at 17:20, arriving at Taoyuan International Airport at 21:50.
